These include: Couchiching, Seine River, Lac La Croix, Nigigoonsiminikaaning, Rainy River, Naicatchewenin, Stanjikoming, Big Grassy River, Big Island, Ojibways of Onegaming. The Access Centre provides clinical, social, health promotion and preventive services, as well as, access to traditional Ojibway healers.

Mental health services include: Traditional Healing Program, Aboriginal FASD & Child Nutrition Program, Mental Health Program, Mental health services with emphasis on a holistic approach, Provides support, counselling, accompaniment to hospital for individuals at risk of suicide, holds community and school presentations on suicide prevention.

Offers individual, family, group counselling for: Family violence and support, Grief, Parent/child conflicts, teen peer pressure, Substance abuse, Teen violence.
